Last month,forty-four Casa and Petaluma High School students and eight members of PetalumaCity Schools' staff attended the Fulfilling the Dream Conference at Santa RosaJunior College. An estimated 350students from multiple countries attended the event to learn about pathways topost-secondary education for students who are not yet U.S. citizens. This fieldtrip is a great example of the exciting work beingdone at Casa to support the aspirations and hard work of Casa students who comefrom diverse backgrounds and who are historically underrepresented in college.

Casa 10th grader, Maria Gonzalez, attended the conferenceand had this say:

My name is MariaGonzalez. I am a tenth grader at Casa Grande High School. I attended the Dreamers' Conference onFriday, November 6, 2015. I attended, even though I am not a Dreamer. I thought it would be a greatopportunity to listen to different stories and find out about the lives ofDreamers in our community. I realized that not only are there very interestingstories, but also a lot of ways Dreamers can attend college. They informed usthat there are scholarship opportunities for everyone. You don't have to be alegal citizen to go to college. There were different workshops we could attendto see the different ways and types of help to keep our education growing. Ibelieve it was a very helpful conference, and they should keep doing it so allof our community can gain this knowledge and go to college.

One of thegreatest strengths of Casa Grande is its diverse student body, which mirrorsstate and national demographic trends. A recent Pew Research Center study (read "5 Facts About America'sStudents" below) indicates that American students are more diverse and also "ontrack to be better educated" than previous generations.

In a few weeks, America's roughly 53.5 million K-12 students will head to the classroom. Trading in swimming pools and summer jobs for math problems and history homework, these students will hit the books at one of more than 129,200 schools across the country, including about 5,700 charter schools and 30,900 private schools.


